Her journey to the Brown School began with a role, providing technical support to the Director General at the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control and Prevention, where she gained exposure to the powerful role policy plays in shaping public health outcomes.



This experience, combined with her background in physiotherapy, sparked her passion for global health, built environment policies, and physical activity promotion—ultimately leading her to pursue an MPH in Health Policy.



Dubbed a National Treasure and a force to be reckoned with, award-winning actress/ activist, and author, Jenifer Lewis, star of the 8 seasoned hit TV show Black-ish, has appeared in over 400 episodic television shows, 68 movies, 143 animations, and 4 Broadway shows.





Jenifer has performed in more than 200 concerts worldwide including, sold out audiences at Lincoln Center and an electrifying standing ovation at Carnegie Hall.

Her accomplishments as an entertainer and community activist have been recognized with an honorary doctorate from her Alma Mater, Webster University and the Career Achievement Award from The American Black Film Festival. On Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday, The King Center for Non-Violent Social Change awarded Jenifer with the Yolanda D. King Higher Ground Award.

In November 2022, Jenifer published her second critically acclaimed book "Walking in my Joy: In These Streets" and was honored by the Congressional Black Caucus. Jenifer received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame July 15, 2022. She was born and raised in Kinloch, Missouri.

Commitment to Open & Respectful Events

Washington University fully embraces a commitment to presenting a wide diversity of ideas and opinions, as well as encouraging free discussion of those ideas and opinions.

With this commitment in mind, the university agrees that event proceedings and guest speakers should expect to be heard without interference from or harassment by those who oppose their views or positions, and that posters, banners, noisemakers and other distractions should not be brought into the presentation area during a program or talk, so that an environment free of interference, distraction and intimidation shall be maintained.

The Washington University policy is: No placards, banners, noisemakers and other distractions are permitted in outdoor or indoor presentation areas on campus – either in support of or in opposition to speakers or event proceedings. Groups and individuals are free to gather outside of these venues and presentation areas to leaflet, to display posters and banners, to distribute literature and to express their concerns – as long as they do not obstruct entry, disrupt event proceedings, interfere with speakers' ability to be heard, or otherwise deny the audience an interruption-free event.
