As a Cancer Epidemiologist Fellow, she enhanced her research skills and commitment to improving healthcare outcomes for vulnerable populations.

Expanding her expertise, Wayne worked as a research assistant at the Brown School's Prevention Research Center, addressing health disparities related to obesity through policy actions and community-based interventions.
